The possibility of using Winslow Township's grader was discussed. This matter will be looked in to.

Sykesville Borough asked to rent the street sweeper at charge of \$100.00/hr.

Motion made by Scolese seconded by Popson to approve the above mentioned request from Sykesville Borough. It should be noted that the charge for anyone renting the sweeper will be \$100.00/hr.

At this time a motion was made by Scolese and seconded by McMillen to approve the financial statements.

Scolese brought up McCabe Drug's sidewalk. He feels that 45 days is not enough time due to the winter. The possibility of cold patching it through the winter was discussed. Caltagarone was directed to inform Kirkwood that McCabe's has until spring time to get it fixed.


